From the Pastor

Trinity hosted a leadership retreat on Saturday, January 20, 2024. It was great to share the space with our siblings in faith from First Presbyterian, St. Paul's Lutheran, and Fisher/ Bygland Parish. While it would have been easy to commiserate about shared problems, our work was about looking forward, identifying values, forming value statements, providing a framework for future decisions and work. We have also noticed a decrease in families in Sunday worship from this age group. Regular worship attendance reminds us of God's presence in our lives, teaches us the essentials of the Christian faith, brings us together as a community of believers, and encourages inter-generational relationships. Our preaching series in Lent, Altered By The Spirit, provides us a unique opportunity to proclaim a message on Sunday and then go deeper on Wednesday. Please make a special effort to attend on either Sunday or Wednesday or both.

Special thanks to Dan and Christine Erdman who have agreed to cook our Wednesday evening meals and our Trinity serving groups for serving and clean up. If work keeps you from serving a funeral reception, this Wednesday opportunity can engage you in an easy way and attend worship. Please say "yes" when your serving group leader calls.



Easter: Life Altered

Lent is a time of self-reflection, spiritual discipline, commitment, and community. This Lent we are going to look at a kaleidoscope of stories from the Book of Acts. We'll see the ways the Spirit alters our perspective, transforms our communities, and consistently blazes a trail ahead of us. Because the Spirit is alive in, with, and under our ordinary lives, always calling us forward into transformation, nudging us into wholeness, and beckoning us forth into an alternative way.

The writer of Luke and Acts clearly desires to tell the story of God's redeeming and saving love in Jesus Christ. Acts continues on from Luke, giving a systemic presentation of the growth of the Christian church from its beginnings in Jerusalem. This account is presented with many details about people and places.

The writer, trying to do more than tell the history of the early church, offers a defense of faith in Jesus Christ, including arguments that the faith is meant for both Jews and Gentiles. The stories and speeches by key leaders demonstrate how quickly Christianity spread beyond Jerusalem. The writer also seeks to show the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the early believers as they face persecution and opposition to their witness.

What is Per Capita?

UNDERSTANDING PER CAPITA AND UNIFIED MISSION GIVING


The 2024 Per Capita Apportionment is \$50. This is the amount that our congregation sends for the year, for each church member, to the Presbytery. Then the Presbytery also sends funds to the Synod and to the General Assembly based on each church's membership. To date, twelve of our church members have given their per capita this year.

Our Presbytery of the Northern Plains, in which we have representation, and a voice and a vote, has the responsibility to set the per capita rate each year. This is a policy approved through the General Assembly. Presbyterian records in the US indicate we have been doing a per capita collection since 1734. The US Constitution actually gets some of its wording and structure from Presbyterians!!


Presbyterians are part of the connectional church. In other words, our Presbyterian congregation is not an island, going it alone. Our denomination has a long history of representative governance that allows us to participate in carrying out the work of Christian discipleship in our church, our region (our Presbytery), our state and neighboring states (our Synod) and nationally and internationally (General Assembly). Being part of expanded groups, we are able to contribute to and support lare global missions.

Our congregation also benefits from the resources made available to us as a connectional church. For instance, the large Congregrational Leadership Connection (CLC) Program online gives us assistance and access to the applications of pastors searching for a new church. We used the CLC and found Pastor Mike.

Lenten Book Study: Thursdays 1:00-2:00



For Lent we will be reading, "Pause: Spending Lent with the Psalms"

A book that invites us to take up the spiritual practice of encountering, sinking into, and deeply engaging with one psalm each week during Lent and Holy Week.

The season of Lent encourages Christians to consider a different

pace—one of slowing down, noticing, pausing—than what our dominant culture values. The invitation to pause with the Psalms begins on Ash Wednesday, starting with a mark of ashes on our foreheads that reminds us that in spite of our failures-things we have done or failed to do-we belong to God. Readers are then guided into an exploration of Psalm 51 and the theme of a clean heart. Each chapter helps readers to connect an image drawn from that psalm, such as paths, faces, blessing, tables, waiting, thanksgiving, listening, being alone or abandoned, and hands, with their own lives. At the close of each chapter, readers are invited to try a different prayer practice to help them continue to reflect on the theme and psalm each day. This intentional engagement—without feeling burdensome—opens just enough space and time for a creative spiritual practice to flourish, sustaining the life of faith during the Lenten season in ways that can make a difference in God's world.
