

# Feed my Starving Children, Fargo MobilePack January 7th—Fargodome


MOBILEPACK-

### Christmas Offering for Care and Share Food Shelf

During the month of December, all cash offerings and checks made out to Trinity with "Care and Share" in the memo will go to support the Food Shelf housed at the Care and Share facility. As you know, grocery prices have been moving up and puts the pinch on a lot of household budgets. For those wih minimal or no income, the struggle is made ever more real. A lot of fixed income households also are squeezing every dollar to put food on the table.

Your donations to the Food Shelf enable the Care and Share to purchase food and supplies that are in need in our locality. While the North Country Food Bank in East Grand Forks does supply most of the food, there is need for those items that are not always available to meet certain food restrictions in a number of households. Trinity will be receiving your donations through Sunday morning offerings, checks placed in the mail, or our drop box. You can also go to our Vanco giving app and select "Care and Share."





### Pastor Ozaki's Letter

I write to you on my 40th birthday, quarantined in my room with COVID-19, hoping the kids don't get it. Clearly, it's not what I expected, but it may be the perfect example of why we still need this season of Advent so badly.

Advent, the season of hope, waiting and preparation is mainly used to settling into the "Christmas Season" today, but when it began (and most of Christian history) the main thing people did was...fasting. Why? Because they understood deeply where God's

hope and joy come from. Not learning to grab more of what we want but from getting good at holding the hard stuff we can't avoid. The waiting, the trusting, the wondering if it will come. Advent is God's annual practice run for these skills so that we might "be still and know that God is God" when we're forced to hold it all in real life.

We don't fast for Advent anymore, and that's ok, traditions change. But we could still use the practice, couldn't we?

Alternatively, we have "Advent calendars" with chocolate, jerky, or beer behind the daily doors for that gift opening rush or a program every weekend to give us those Christmas fuzzies. None of which are bad, but what if the rush to avoid waiting until the 25th is keeping us from becoming something more than consumers. Something that kept Christians coming back for 1500 years? Well before there were any toys to open.

Sitting here in my bed, disappointed and waiting for...I don't even know. I see a video of someone ranting because their package was late, another shows a guy screaming insults on a plane when asked to wear a mask, while another talks about how drug abuse in people over 50 is rising sharply due to anxiety.

Then I see one more, a news report with an older woman sitting beside another asleep in a hospital bed. When the reporter asked how she has the patience to come and sit like this for so long, the woman smiles and squeezes her partner's hand. "I've had to wait most of my life, through terrible things, to be able to call her mine. All that made me good at it. Loving means trusting that the wait is worth it."

This season, may we allow Advent to do it's work on us. May we become good at waiting and as a result, may we become as strong as loving as the Christ who comes on Christmas morning.


